DESIGNATED TRADE ALLIES: ACTION NEEDED

If your company has attended a Designated Trade Ally Training in the past, but has not completed 2016 Applications or attended a training for the 2017 Program Year, you could be at risk of being removed from the Designated Trade Ally Program.

To keep your status active, you must attend the Designated Trade Ally portion of one of our 2017 Program Kick-off Meetings in January (see Page 2 for registration information).

If you cannot attend a kick-off meeting, your Designated Trade Ally status won't be confirmed until you attend one of the monthly trainings, which resume in February.

Once your status is confirmed, your company will receive a personalized certificate of having completed Trade Ally training.



Training sessions are held the second Thursday of each month (February – November) in the New Center One Building in Detroit.

2017 PROGRAM FEATURES & IMPORTANT CHANGES

A number of program, measure and incentive changes were made in the 2017 program. What follows is a review of Program highlights.

Catalog and Application

The **Catalog** contains the Program's general requirements and the specifications for all measures, and is available for download from our website (see other side).

New for 2017: New Construction incentives are now part of the regular Program Application. (See below)

Agriculture Incentives

Agriculture incentives appear near the back of the main Program **Application** — and also are available through a separate, stand-alone Application.

Incentive Caps

Program caps remain unchanged.

New Construction

New for 2017: New Construction/Major Renovation incentives are in the main **Application**. Systems Approach incentives are now part of the prescriptive section of the **Application**. The LEED Whole Building and the LEED Design Review Assistance incentive worksheets are located in the back of the **Application**.

Special Offers

Multi-Measure Bonus

New for 2017: The bonus is capped at \$2,500 for electric-only measures; \$2,500 gas-only measures; up to \$5,000 for **Applications** with both electric and gas measures. Click **here** for the fact sheet.

Michigan-Made Bonus

New for 2017: The bonus is reduced to 10%. This bonus is available for certain prescriptive measures when at least 50% of the content is Michigan-made. Click **here** for the fact sheet.

Michigan Saves Financing

New for 2017: Incentives will be used to <u>buy down</u> the interest rates offered by Michigan Saves. The actual buy down amount cannot be greater than the total amount of the incentives awarded on the Application. Click **here** for the fact sheet.

Custom measures

New for 2017: Only DLC-listed lighting is eligible for incentives (see below); fluorescents, CFLs are **not** eligible.

New measure

New for 2017: Pre-rinse sprayers for electric water heat: •\$30/sprayer (same incentive level as for the gas heat measure)

Removed measures

New for 2017: The following measures have been removed:

- •All induction and fluorescent lighting including CFLs
- •The de-lamping incentive
- •These LEDs:
 - LL-1 = LED A-Line Lamps <19 watts
 - LL-2 = LED A-Line Lamps ≥19 watts
 - LL-4 = LED MR16 Lamps
 - LL-5 = LED/PAR/BR/R Lamps
 - LL-6 = LED Candelabra Lamps replacing incandescent candelabras
 - LL-7 = LED Globe Lamps replacing incandescent globes
 - LL-8 = LED A-Line Lamps replacing CFL A-line
 - LL-9 = LED PAR/BR/R Lamps replacing CFL PAR/BR/R Lamps
 - LL-10 = LED Recessed Down Lights replacing CFL recessed down lights

Incentive changes

New for 2017: LED lighting that is listed by the **Design Light Consortium** (DLC) is the **standard** measure for certain fixtures.

• Non-DLC fixtures receive half the standard incentive.

•To qualify, the fixture must be listed on the DLC website: www.designlights.org
